The Winnipeg Football Club, "the Blue Bombers," is a community owned, non-profit organization directed by a 9 man executive committee elected from the 73 man board of directors.

Day to day decisions, affecting conduct of Blue Bomber business, are made by the General Manager who is in complete charge of all football operations. Canadian Football League and Western Conference Policies, long-term financial planning and construction projects fall under the direction of the 9 man executive committee, all of whom are veterans of Bomber service.

President Joe Wilder begins his first year of a two-year term having served on the Bomber Directorate since 1970. Joe has chaired various committees and has served as Vice-President since 1976. Past-President, Ross Smith, remains active on the Executive Committee. Vice-Presidents George Graham, Harvey Scrivener, Don McKenzie and Don Leaney have all chaired committees which coordinate Blue Bomber activities such as the Annual Dinner and Miss Blue Bomber Pageant. Along with Dr. Jan Brown and Bill Morton, they assist in formulating policy regarding long term financial planning, construction projects and League and Conference business.

The Executive and Directors of the Winnipeg Football Club are Manitoba citizens who voluntarily assist the club to insure the longer term stability of a C.F.L. franchise in Winnipeg.

# Head Coach



**Ray Jauch**

Ray Jauch's coaching reputation and high standards are renowned throughout the C.F.L. As Ray enters his third season with the Blue Bombers, the club is confident that his winning attitude will rub off on his players. In nine seasons as a head coach, Ray Jauch's teams have made 7 playoff and 3 Grey Cup appearances.

The 1970 Coach of the Year was himself a star high school athlete at Mendota, Illinois before moving on to the University of Iowa. At Iowa under Coach Forrest Evashevski, Ray played halfback for the Hawkeyes' 1959 Rose Bowl team and graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in physical education. He came to Winnipeg in 1960 to begin his professional career, but his playing days ended prematurely when he tore an achilles tendon in the 1961 Grey Cup game.

Ray began his coaching career with the St. James Rods in 1962 and in 1964 returned to Iowa as an assistant with Jerry Burns. Two years later he returned to the C.F.L. with the Edmonton Eskimos alongside head coach, Neil Armstrong.

In 1970, when Armstrong went to the N.F.L. Ray was offered and accepted the head coach's post. Seven years later he left the coaching ranks to become Manager of Football Operations in Edmonton. The Winnipeg Football Club was pleased that Ray chose to "return to the sidelines" as Head Coach of the Blue Bombers.

Ray and his wife, Sarah have four sons, Jeff, John, Jim and Joey.

# Assistant Coaches Defence



**LEO MCKILLIP**  
Defensive Coach

Leo will handle the defense under Head Coach Ray Jauch. McKillip had previously been the defensive co-ordinator with the Edmonton Eskimos for the past four years.

Leo began his coaching career in Kimball, Nebraska in 1954 at the high school level. A year later he joined the Idaho State

University staff and served as assistant coach for eleven years.

In 1965, Leo took over as Head Coach at Idaho State and in 1970 moved to St. Mary's College as head coach. From St. Mary's, he joined the Edmonton staff in 1974.

As a player, Leo attended Notre Dame University and played on the 1949 National Championship team for Notre Dame's great coach Frank Leahy.

Born in Denver, Colorado, January 26th, 1929, Leo was raised in Nebraska and after graduating from Notre Dame, he served a two year stint in the U.S. Air Force.

Coach McKillip's academic background includes a Masters Degree from Nebraska in 1955 and his doctorate in Physical Education from the University of Utah in 1972.

Defensive Line  
Coach

Coach Stauber will work with the Blue Bomber defensive line. Gene has had previous C.F.L. experience as he worked as an assistant with the Calgary Stampeders under head coach, Bob Baker in 1976.

Gene began coaching in 1947 at the University of Toledo, after having served in W.W. II in the 362nd Infantry Brigade, 91st Division in Africa and Italy. Even in war

time he had time for football as he played in the "Spaghetti Bowl Game" between the 5th Army and the 12th Air Force in Florence, Italy in 1945.

Stateside, Gene has had coaching experience at major universities including Michigan, Nebraska, Illinois and University of California at Berkeley. Coach Stauber took Illinois and U.C.-Berkeley to the Rose Bowl.

Gene and his wife Eileen have 2 children. Gene has a Bachelor of Education Degree from Toledo and a Masters Degree in Science from Michigan.

**ELLIS  
RAINSBERGER**  
Offensive Coach

Coach Rainsberger will handle the Blue Bomber offensive line and work with Coach Jauch in developing the Blue Bombers' attack.

Coach Rainsberger has had a long and successful career at major universities. In his last coaching assignment he was head

coach at Kansas State University, his alma mater.

Before that, the red-haired East St. Louis, Illinois native had enjoyed assistant coaching stints at Illinois (1967-72), at Kansas (1965) and Drake (1959-60-61), and head coaching positions at Washburn (1962-63-64) and Southern Illinois (1966).

At Wisconsin, under Rainsberger's tutelage, the Badgers ranked eighth in the nation in scoring, and second in the Big Ten in total offense in 1974.

During his collegiate days at Kansas State, he was a two-time all-Big Seven performer and captained Bus Mertes-coached KSU football elevens in 1956 and 1957. Rainsberger, although weighing less than 200 pounds, was a Missouri Valley heavyweight champion. And he was only KSU's third academic all-American footballer.

Coach Rainsberger and his wife, Shirley, have six children.



**BOB  
VESPAZIANI**  
Asst. Offensive Coach

Last season, Bob Vespaziani, a native of Quincy, Massachusetts, joined the Bombers as an assistant offensive coach.

Over the previous eight years Coach Vespaziani put together an excellent record as Head Coach of the Acadia University Axemen.

He joined the Axemen in 1969 as defensive co-ordinator and took over the head coaching reins in 1971. Since then his teams have been 51-22 including being undefeated in 1974 and have won the At-

lantic Universities Athletic Association title on three occasions, in 1975, 1976 and 1977.

Three times, in 1972, 1975 and 1976, Coach Vespaziani was named A.U.A.A. "Coach of the Year." As well, he served as an assistant coach at the Can-Am Bowl in both 1977 and 1978.

Respected as one of the best college coaches in C.I.A.U. history, Coach Vespaziani has turned out 10 "All Canadians" since 1974 and three of those players, Al Charuk, Bob Cameron and Bob Stracina have been awarded the Hec Creighton Trophy as Most Outstanding College Football Player in Canada. As well, seven of his Axemen have played in the two Can-Am Bowls since 1978.

The 43 year old Vespaziani graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Physical Education in 1958 from Springfield College in Massachusetts and he earned his Masters of Education from Springfield the following year.

Coach Vespaziani is married and he and his wife, June, have five children, Robert Jr., Michael, Lori, Joseph and Jennifer.

**ALLEMANG, Marv — GUARD / CENTRE / DEF. END., No. 58 Ht: 6'5" Wt: 235 lbs. Born: March 12/53 Ancaster, Ontario D-FA-75 (Ottawa) 6th year Acadia University**

Non-Import — Marv was picked as a free agent in 1975 from the Acadia Axemen. He played with the Riders in 75 and 76 then went to British Columbia in a trade in 1977. Late in 1977 he moved to Hamilton. The Bombers picked him up in a pre-season trade with the Tiger-Cats that sent Jim Heighinton and Harry Walters to Hamilton. As a pro, Marv has been very versatile, playing defensive end, defensive tackle, linebacker, offensive guard, offensive tackle and centre.

Allemang played for four years under now Bomber offensive backfield coach, Bob Vespaziani at Acadia University. In 1972, he was named All-League offensive tackle and team MVP. In 1973, he was an All-League defensive end, team MVP and All-Canadian.

**BASTAJA, Nick — OFFENSIVE TACKLE, No. 58 Ht: 6'2" Wt: 267 lbs. Born: February 4/53 6th year Simon Fraser**

Nick Bastaja is a five year Canadian Football League veteran. The 6 foot, two inch, 267 pound, non-import lineman was a CFL All-Star in 1976 and 1977, and was the Argonauts' 1978 nominee in the Schenley Award Most Outstanding Offensive Lineman category.

In 1979 the hard-working Simon Fraser Grad provided excellent pass and drive blocking for the Argos, as well as recovering two fumbles. Nick was named to the EFC All Star Team in 1979.

Nick played his high school football at Hamilton's Delta Secondary School before moving on to Simon Fraser University. He was originally one of the Hamilton Tiger Cat's two territorial protected players prior to the 1975 Canadian College Draft.

Nick is single and resides in Burnaby, B.C. during the off-season and coaches spring football at his Alma Mater, Simon Fraser.



**BELL Joe — DEFENSIVE END, No. 78 Ht: 6'3" Wt: 268 lbs. Born: April 20/56 1st year Norfolk St.**

Joe was one of the highly sought after free agent players following the 1979 NFL draft. Following the 1979 Black College All Star Game, Joe received offers from a number of NFL clubs and elected to sign with the Oakland Raiders. Joe made the Oakland roster in 1979 having played extremely well in pre-season play. Bell was waived by the Raiders during the 1979 season and the Blue Bombers began their recruiting process. Joe visited Winnipeg twice and decided that his best opportunity was with Winnipeg.

Joe is single and is currently doing some post graduate studies in his home town of Chicago.



**BENNETT, Paul — DEFENSIVE BACK, No. 27 Ht: 5'10" Wt: 175 lbs. Born: March 27/54 3rd year Wilfred Laurier University**

Non-Import — Paul Bennett wasted no time in making his presence felt in the C.F.L. As a rookie with the Argos he was a starter in the defensive secondary and set a new C.F.L. single season yardage record as a punt returner with 965 yards. In the same year he finished third in the EFC in kickoff returns and fourth in interception returns. Last season he finished second in the E.F.C. in kick-off yardage with 18 returns for 429 yards.

Bennett graduated from Scarborough's W.A. Porter Collegiate Institute where he attained numerous All-Star and Most Valuable Player honours . . . He then attended the University of Missouri (Columbia) on a football scholarship. After completing two years at Missouri (1973 and 1974) for the Tigers, Bennett returned to Canada and played for the University of Waterloo (Ontario) in 1975 and in 1976 he was chosen both a Canadian Intercollegiate Athletic Union All-Star and an Ontario Quebec Intercollegiate Football Conference All Star . . . Bennett led the O-QIFC in 1976 as a punt returner returning the ball 33 times for 686 yards, a 20.8 yard average and scoring five touchdowns. His longest effort went 107 yards for a major score . . . In 1976 playoff competition he returned the opening kickoff 97 yards for a TD . . . One of Argos' two territorially protected players prior to CFL's 1977 College Draft.

Bennett, a Toronto native is single and resides in Scarborough.



**BONK, John — CENTRE, No. 43 Ht: 6'2" Wt: 240 lbs. Born: August 27/50 Hamilton, Ontario D-FA (Hamilton) 8th year Burlington Braves**

Non-Import — John came to the Bombers in 1973 in a trade with Hamilton for defensive back, Peter Robbins. He has played defensive end, linebacker and centre. In 1978, he took over the Centre position when Bob Swift retired and has been the starter ever since. He is one of the most proficient players in the CFL when it comes to long snaps for field goals and punts.

John didn't play college football instead came to the CFL through the junior ranks with the Burlington Braves.

John and his wife, Chris, along with their one son, Jessie live in Winnipeg, where John is involved in sales and promotions. He is very committed to Athletes in Action.



**BRAGAGNOLO, Mark — RUNNING BACK, No. 22 Ht: 6'1" Wt: 215 lbs. Born: October 20/55 4th year U. of Toronto**

In three seasons with the Argonauts, Mark Bragagnolo has developed into a solid Canadian Football League performer. Mark has proved himself to be a good inside runner and is known for his hard-driving, determined style.



In his rookie season Mark posted a 5.0 yard rushing average with 261 yards on 52 carries, as well as three receptions for 40 yards. The following year he gained 377 yards on 82 carries and caught 25 passes out of the backfield for an additional 160 yards, as well as leading the Club in T.D.'s with five.

Mark was one of the Argos two territorial protected players prior to the 1977 Canadian College Draft. From 1974 through '76 Mark won three consecutive O-QIFC rushing titles as he carried the ball 369 times for 2,281 yards and 20 touchdowns. An avid weightlifter, he spends a lot of time on physical conditioning and weight training.



**BROCK, Dieter — QUARTERBACK,** No. 5 Ht: 6'0" Wt: 198 lbs. Born: February 12/51 Cadsden, Alabama D-FA-74 7th year Jacksonville State

Import — Dieter is entering his sixth season with the Club after signing as a free agent in 1974. He started his professional career as the understudy to Don Jonas and Chuck Ealey but on October 5th, 1975, against Montreal, he assumed the starting role and has been the Bomber's No. 1 quarterback ever since. In only six seasons, Brock has 1081 completions for 14,389 yards to put him second on the Bombers All-time list in both categories, just behind Kenny Ploen. He is presently third on the Bombers' all-time touchdown pass list with 88. He holds the record for pass completions with 294 set in 1978, is second in career pass completions on the club, is second in career passes thrown, and

holds the record for most passes in a game and in a season.

Dieter started his college career at Auburn in 1969 where he earned All-Alabama honours but transferred to Jacksonville State for the 1972 and 1973 seasons. There he was the team's Most Valuable Player and earned Honourable Mention Little-All-American. He played in the 1974 Senior Bowl and was team captain at Jacksonville.

Dieter and his wife Kathy have 2 children. He is extremely strong and has always been a dedicated weight lifter. In the off-season, he and his family reside in Birmingham, Alabama.



**BURLEY, Ecomet — DEFENSIVE END,** No. 74 Ht: 6'0" Wt: 240 lbs. Born: June 6/54 5th year Texas State

During his playing career with the Toronto Argonauts Burley was chosen as an Eastern Football Conference All-Star in 1977 and successfully recovered from a torn achilles tendon in '78 just in time to play in the final game of the Double Blue.

Burley had a very impressive college career at Texas Tech achieving numerous awards and selections. Some of them being the Most Valuable Defensive Player in the 1972 Sun Bowl Game, a player of the Southwest Athletic Conference All-Star team and Sophomore Player-of-the-Year in 1973, and in 1974 he was selected to the Sportswriter's All-American All-Star Second team. During his senior year he was picked to the SAC All-Star First team playing the nose guard position.

Larry, a final cut from the Green Bay Packers joined the Hamilton Tiger-Cats in 1976. Although he joined half-way through the season he was still named to the E.F.C. All-Star team. Larry repeated the honour in '77 and '78 as well.

Larry was acquired by the Winnipeg Blue Bombers this year through a trade involving Kicker, Bernie Ruoff.



**CAMERON, Bob — QUARTERBACK / PUNTER,** No. 6 Ht: 6'0" Wt: 180 lbs. Born: July 18/54 1st year Acadia

Bob was drafted in the first round of the 1977 Canadian College Draft by the Edmonton Eskimos.

Bob was the recipient of numerous awards, some of them being the C.I.A.U. All Canadian Quarterback in 1976 and '77. He was the Hec Creighton Award winner in 1977 and A.U.A.A. League's Most Valuable Player in '76, '77 and '78.

Bob was coached at Acadia by the Bombers very own Bob Vespaziani and graduated with a Bachelor of Science and a Bachelor of Education.



**EZERINS, Leo — TIGHT END/LINE-BACKER,** No. 72 Ht: 6'4" Wt: 225 lbs. Born: August 10/56 Winnipeg D-TP-78 (Winnipeg) 3rd year Whitworth College

Non-Import — Two seasons ago, Leo came out of college into a starting tight end position with the Bombers. He was 23rd in receiving in the Western Conference with 23 receptions for 252 yards and an 11.0 yards per catch average. Import — Big John came to the Bombers in a multi-player pre-season trade last season and has become an anchor on the defensive line. With Calgary for the previous ten years, Helton was outstanding. He has been All-Canadian seven times, All-W.F.C. ten times, was the Schenley Award Winner as outstanding defensive player in 1972 and 1974, and won the Tom Pate Award in 1978 as the Outstanding Defensive Lineman as voted by the players. The Pennsylvania native played on the Stamps' Grey Cup winner in 1971 and has been voted Calgary's Most Popular Player six times.

He was a three year starter for Wilfred Laurier's Golden Hawks, and with the University of Colorado as a freshman.



**HOLMES, Mike — WIDE RECEIVER,** No. 70 Ht: 6'1" Wt: 198 lbs. Born: Nov. 18/50 Galveston, Texas D-1-73 (San Francisco) 7th year Texas Southern Univ.

Import — With his exceptional (4.5 in the 40) speed, Mike Holmes can electrify a crowd. He joined the Bombers as a free agent on September 24th, 1977 and played in the last 6 games and the Western Semi-final that season. **KROHN, Jim — QUARTERBACK, No. 10** Ht: 6'3" Wt: 196 lbs. Born July 27/57 1st year U. of Arizona

During a four year career at the University of Arizona, Jim Krohn has gained an impressive reputation as a young quarterback. In 1979, he had 93 completions in 151 attempts for 1,094 yards and 7 touchdowns. Jim also rushed for 257 yards, primarily via the quarterback option.

In his junior year Jim led the Pac-10 in passing until suffering a mid-season arm injury, but still finished third in conference passing with 996 total yards and 9 touchdowns.

Non-Import — A solid back-up at the running back and slot-back positions last

season. John will get a good look at both positions in 1980. Has good hands, 4.8 speed in the 40, and is an exceptional blocker. Very strong, he can dead-lift 350 lbs. and bench press 220.

**NORMAN, Butch — OFFENSIVE TACKLE, No. 66 Ht: 6'6" Wt: 267 lbs. Born, August 23/52 Luverne, Alabama FA-1974 7th year University of Alabama**

Import — Butch was actually cut in 1974 but patience paid off as an injury to Bill Frank put Norman in the lineup and he has started at offensive tackle ever since. His best year was in 1976 when he earned W.F.C. and C.F.L. All-Star honours. In 1978 Butch won the Bert Oja Memorial Trophy as the Bombers' outstanding lineman.

**PASSAGLIA, Walt — WIDE RECEIVER, No. 24 Ht: 5'11" Wt: 183 lbs. Born: November 1/57 2nd year Simon Fraser University**

Non-Import — The early season injury of Joe Poplawski last season pressed the Bomber rookie into a starting role earlier than he expected, and Walt responded with an outstanding season. He finished the '79 season with 51 catches for 626 yards, a 12.3 yard per catch average and a pair of touchdowns.

Non-Import — 1978, his rookie season, was a banner year for Joe. He coasted to the pass-receiving title with 75, six in front of Gord Paterson and eight ahead of the Eastern champ, Tony Gabriel. He was second in yardage gained in the West with 998 and third overall behind Gabriel and Edmonton's Tom Scott. He scored 8 touchdowns receiving tied with Mike Holmes for fourth in the C.F.L. All these achievements led to his winning the SCHENLEY AWARD as the League's top rookie. Last year Joe broke his ankle early in the year and missed the entire season. Bobby came to the Big Blue in the middle of last season from Kansas State. The 6'8", 290 pound giant was one of the most highly sought after high school players in America in his senior year. At Kansas State Bobby established himself early in his rookie year as an all conference selection. At only 21 years of age Bobby has shown the kind of progress

Bobby is very active in the off-season helping out with public appearances and speaking engagements for the Club.



**TOOGOOD, Bob — LINEBACKER, No. 32** Ht: 6'2" Wt: 225 lbs. Born: September 6/48 D-2-73 (Saskatchewan) 7th year University of Manitoba

Non-Import — After being released by Saskatchewan in 1973 he returned to the University of Manitoba and joined the Bombers in 1974. He won the starting role that year from Rob McLaren but missed the last 6 games because of ankle injury. Since then Bob has been a steady performer at linebacker and the coaching staff is looking for his experience to help anchor the very young linebacking corps.

Larry's health has again returned and his outstanding pre-season efforts earned him a starting job in the most competitive Bomber backfield in years.

3/55 1st year Grambling

Robert holds the NCAA Punt Return record with a 25.4 yard average the highest recorded average in the history of NCAA football. He had a 14.6 yard all-purpose average in 1977.

In his senior year Woods returned punts of 72, 62 and 46 yards for touchdowns as well as kick-offs of 87 and 97 yards for touchdowns. In addition, he caught touchdown passes of 52, 56, 68 and 85 yards.

The two kick-off and four punt return touchdowns in a single season stands as a school record.

The Grambling speedster also distinguished himself on the track where he was the South West Atlantic Conference 100 and 200 meter champ in 1975, 1976 and 1977. Robert consistently turned in 9.1's for the 100 yard dash and a 100 meter clocking of 10.04. In 1976 he was the 6th fastest human in the world.

Robert has run the 40 in 4.29 seconds.
