OTIS W. DOUGLAS, JR. - HEAD COACH

Otis was born in Readville, Virginia, one of a family of ten. He graduated in Physical Education from the College of William and Mary in Williamsburg, Virginia, and played guard and tackle in his college football days. After receiving a Doctorate degree in Education and Masters in Arts, he was assistant coach at his Alma Mater for seven years. From there he went to the University of Akron, serving as Athletic Director until 1942.

For the next three years, Otis was in the Navy where he coached with Jim Tatum and played at Jacksonville Naval Air Station. He played three years with the Philadelphia Eagles who won the World Championship in 1948-49. From here, his coaching duties took him to Drexel Tech., University of Arkansas (in the tough South-West Conference), Baltimore Colts and the Chicago Cardinals where he was defensive coach and then to Villanova University. He left Villanova during the 1956 season to accept the Head Coaching job with the Stampeders.

Coach Douglas is married and has two children, Eleanor 11 and Otis, Jr., 16 years of age. Their home is in Hague, Virginia, where such businesses as Pheasant and Oyster farming and running a resort keep him busy in the off-season. A great asset to these careers is his flying ability, as he has been an aviator for nineteen years.

TOMMY THOMPSON - ASSISTANT COACH

Born in Hutchison, Kansas, Tommy played his college football at Tulsa University in Oklahoma. In 1939 and 1940 he played with Pittsburgh of the N.F.L. - moved to the Philadelphia Eagles in 1941 and 1942, then joined the U.S. Army to serve in Europe. On his discharge in 1944 he rejoined the Eagles at Quarterback for six successful years. During this time, he helped the Eagles win the Eastern Division in 1947 and the World Championship in 1948 and 1949.

Tommy began as backfield coach of Arkansas University for the 1951-52 seasons and held the same position with the Chicago Cardinals in 1954 and 1955. The year between these coaching positions, 1953, he was playing-coach with the Winnipeg Blue Bombers of the W.I.F.U.

Tommy holds records that still exist in the N.F.L. For championship playoffs he threw the most passes (44) and completed the most (27). He holds practically all lifetime passing records of the Eagles.

Tommy and his wife Dodie make their home in Jordan, Arkansas, where they have a vast ranch of cattle and thousands of heads of horses.

Second year with the Stampeders, having played in last seven games of 1956 season for Calgary - Was Cleveland Brown's last cut in 1956 - Born in Ironwood, Michigan where he is at present residing - Just completed post-graduate course and obtained his degree in General Science - Played two years Service ball at Hamilton Air Force Base, California - In 1955 was Captain of his team and named All-Service First Team - Won the Most-Valuable-Player Award, caught 44 passes for 8 TDs - Plans to make Calgary his home - single - U.S. citizen.

FLOYD HARRAWOOD - TACKLE

6'2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " - 242 lbs. - 25 years. Fifth year in W.I.F.U. and third with Stampeders - Attended Tulsa University, Tulsa, Oklahoma, which is his hometown - All W.I.F.U. guard in 1955 while playing for Winnipeg - All Missouri Valley Conference tackle for two straight years at Tulsa - All-Southern Conference tackle in high school at Gulfcoast Military Academy, Mississippi - Only cadet to ever letter in six sports in one year - Has B.A. in Secondary Education and Masters degree - Taught high school for some time - Captain of track team while at Tulsa - 1st Lieutenant in U.S. Air Force Reserve - Owns and operates "Harrowood's Driving Range" in off-season - Married, 1 child - U.S. citizen.

JIM HARRYMAN - HALFBACK

5'11½" - 198 lbs. - 24 years.
