

U. S. COACH IS EMPLOYED FOR HAMILTON TIGERS

Hughit, Former Michigan Player, With Bengals Since Last Monday

Hamilton, Nov. 6.—Tigers have been found out. Spies learned on Wednesday that George Hughet, former member of the University of Michigan team, now a resident of Buffalo and a football player of some class, has been coaching the Tiger team on interference since Monday last. Despite this fact, the final workout today was well guarded, and rumor has it that Hughet's presence has been very beneficial.

The United States star has been on the job every day since Monday, instructing the Awreyites how a ball should be carried and just how interference should be made and stopped. He also taught Tigers how to get their plays into operation much faster, and officials of the club expect the team to give Argos a sound trouncing on Saturday.

Evans Loses His Job.

There is to be a change in the line-up. "Tebber" McKelvey, Johnny Evans's understudy, will be at quarterback when the teams swing into action. Evans's failure to attend the workouts this week has cost him his job, and although nothing definite has been announced, it was learned today on fairly good authority that Burton would assist McKelvey at that position.

It is doubtful if Main will go to the post. The injury he received two weeks ago is still giving him trouble, so much, in fact, that he has been unable to get into the hard workouts held this week. In case Main fails to start, Dr. Weaver will replace him at outside wing.

Despite the injured members on the line-up, Tigers feel confident of defeating Argos. Cox, Timmins and Reid, who spent more time on the sidelines last week than they did in the game, have promised to pay strict attention to their knitting on Saturday, and give the ten thousand or more fans who will be in attendance no chance to "squawk."
