

THIRD CORPS TEAM CRUSHES ARGONAUTS

Three Touchdowns in First Ten
Minutes Decide Game at
Yankee Stadium.

FINAL SCORE IS 55 TO 7

Canadians' Fumbling on Lateral
Passes Proves Disastrous—
Noyes and Dodd Shine.

The Third Corps Area football team had an easy time with the Argonauts of Toronto at the Yankee Stadium yesterday afternoon, winning by the score of 55 to 7. The army eleven gave a brilliant exhibition of open field running, line smashing and forward passing. The famous lateral pass of the Canadians proved of much assistance to the Army boys, for four of the eight touchdowns made by the victors can be traced to fumbled lateral passes. Three times in the third period the Canadians attempted their deceptive passing game with the ball deep in their own territory, only to lose it on fumbles. In each instance the Army eleven lost no time in making capital of the errors, and in two or three plays managed to crash over for the touchdowns.

The veteran Third Corps team got away to a winning start in the first three minutes and before ten minutes of the game had passed the American aggregation had made three touchdowns. The Canadians were at a loss to solve the crisscross, off tackle, fake pass and end run plays. The forward passes were mixed in beautifully and only an improved defense in the closing minutes of the first period checked the scoring of the Army.

The second string backfield men were in the game during the second period and it was while they were in action that the Argonauts managed to make their only touchdown. It was the result of some baffling lateral passing. They carried the ball from their own five-yard line to the Army twenty-five yard line in five plays. From this point Munro, the left halfback, managed to break through on a fake pass and crossed the line without even being tackled.

Noyes, a former Navy halfback who has transferred to the Army, was one of the outstanding heroes of the afternoon. He directed most of the attack and it was he who carried the ball over for the first touchdown, a splendid 25-yard run through a broken field. Dodd, rated a star defensive halfback for the Army at West Point last year, reversed conditions yesterday and was the leading offensive star, accounting for four touchdowns.

Timberlake, another hero at West Point last year and the athlete who caught a forward pass and raced for the touchdown that beat the Navy, was another headliner. He went over for the second touchdown and in addition played a strong game both on the attack and the defense.

The Canadians proved that they still have much to learn about the American game. At the old rugby game of the lateral pass they proved skillful and it was while the second Army team was in the game that they showed to advantage. During their march down the field to their only touchdown they unloosed such a whirlwind attack that the Third Corps team was at a loss to check it.

The best forward pass of the afternoon was one from Rogers to Erdman in the second period, which was good for 30 yards. This pass paved the way to the touchdown for the soldiers.

In the last period the Army, with the ball on the Argonauts' 35-yard line, was penalized half the distance to the goal when Stanowich was put out of the game for slugging. In three plays, two of which were forward passes, the Army gained 50 yards, and when the final whistle blew the Third Corps team was on the Canadians' 15-yard line on the second down.
