MONTREAL 13, ARGONAUTS 5.

The wretched fumbling of the Argonaut back field resulted in the defeat of the Oarsmen at Rosedale on Saturday by 13 to 5. There was little to choose between the teams on the line, but the Montreal back field was so vastly superior to that of the light and dark blue that Chauvel Elliott's men won rather easily. The two Montreal touchdowns were the direct result of fumbles in the exchange of punts between the half lines, Levack losing one in the sun and Norcross making a mess of another. The waded-wheel wings were on top of the fumbles both times.

The attendance was about 1,800 and the weather ideal. Argos won the toss and elected to play with the slight east wind, but against the sun. After some close formation play in midfield Montreal worked the ball to Argos' 35-yard line, and Stinson's long punt got away from Levack. Armstrong, who had broken around the Argonaut end, fell on the ball for a try when it rolled over the line. Duckett failed to convert. Montreal 5, Argos 0.

Levack ran the ball to Montreal's twenty, avoiding several tackles, after taking a bad bounding pass from Coryell. The little Argos fullback was the fastest man on the field, and demonstrated it on several occasions, but his fumbling, in common with the rest of the back division, more than offset his usefulness as a ground gainer. Argos forced play for the remainder of the quarter, and with the ball on Montreal's twenty M. Kent tried a goal from the field, but the ball bounded off one of his own men. The quarter ended at 5 to 0.

At the opening of the second quarter Coryell passed to Corkery, but the pass was wide, and it rolled clear of the right half. "Buz" Bailey, the little Montreal quarter, dribbled almost to the Argos line, but Levack outran all hands and secured Ward and A. Kent exchanged wallows and not five minutes each. The lines were holding well at this stage, and the Montreal back field punted continually, trusting to loose handling of the ball by the local team to gain ground. In an exchange Norcross fumbled and Cameron grabbed the ball on the bound and ran forty yards through a broken field for a try. Duckett converted, and the score was Montreal 11, Argos 0.

Levack made another bad miss, and Montreal secured an Argos' 25. Duckett punted over the line, but M. Kent ran the ball back twenty yards and passed to Stinson, who had broken around the Argonaut end, fell on the ball for a try when it rolled over the line. Duckett converted. Montreal 12, Argos 0.

By means of backs and short-end runs Montreal worked to Argos' ten, but Sinclair bucked for fifteen and Kent ran around the end for another fifteen. The quarter ended with the ball in possession of Montreal at Argos' quarter way.

At the start of the third quarter Scott muffed Coryell's punt on the Montreal line. Sinclair secured and tried to get over, but was declared offside. Murphy got the ball, and after a nice run passed to M. Kent, who fumbled and lost the ball. Coryell got it back by a smash through the line and tackle. Kent kicked a high one, and Russell grabbed it and carried it to within ten yards out, but Montreal threw Murphy back ten yards when he tried an end run. Coryell failed to back through on the third down, but Hencher broke through and downed Stinson for a safety when he tried to kick out. Montreal 12, Argos 2.
