



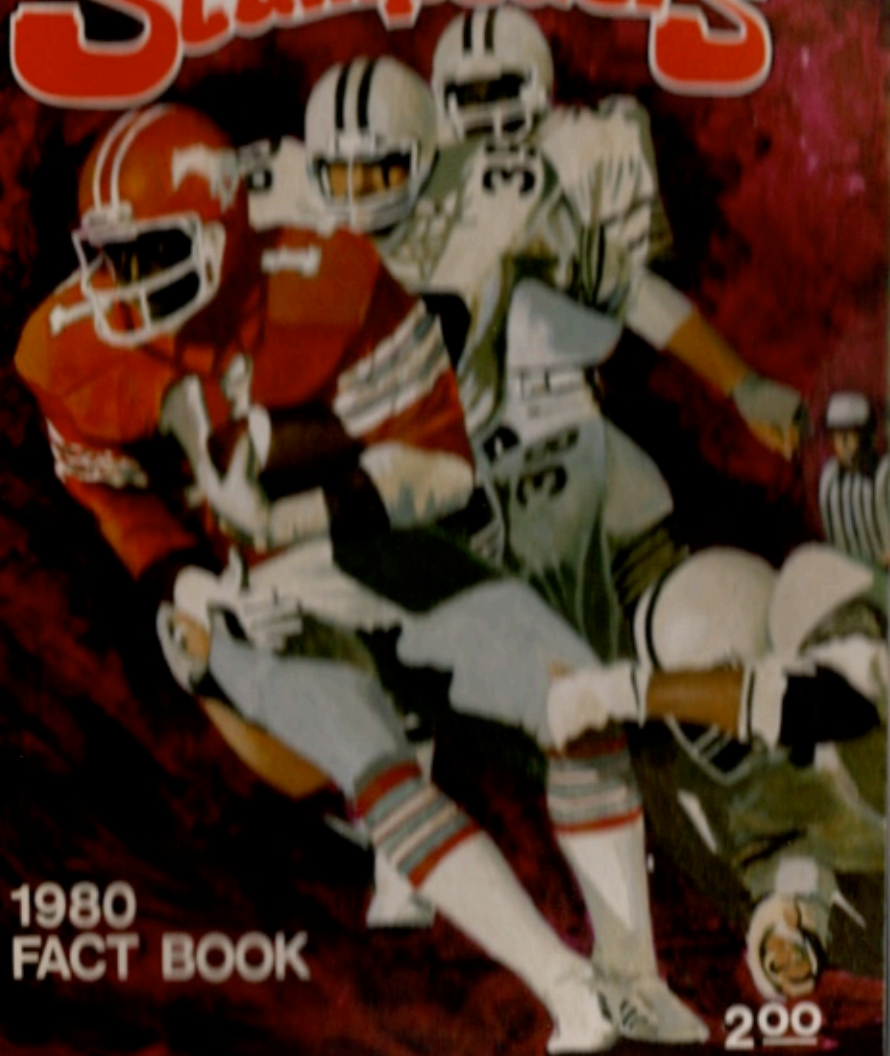

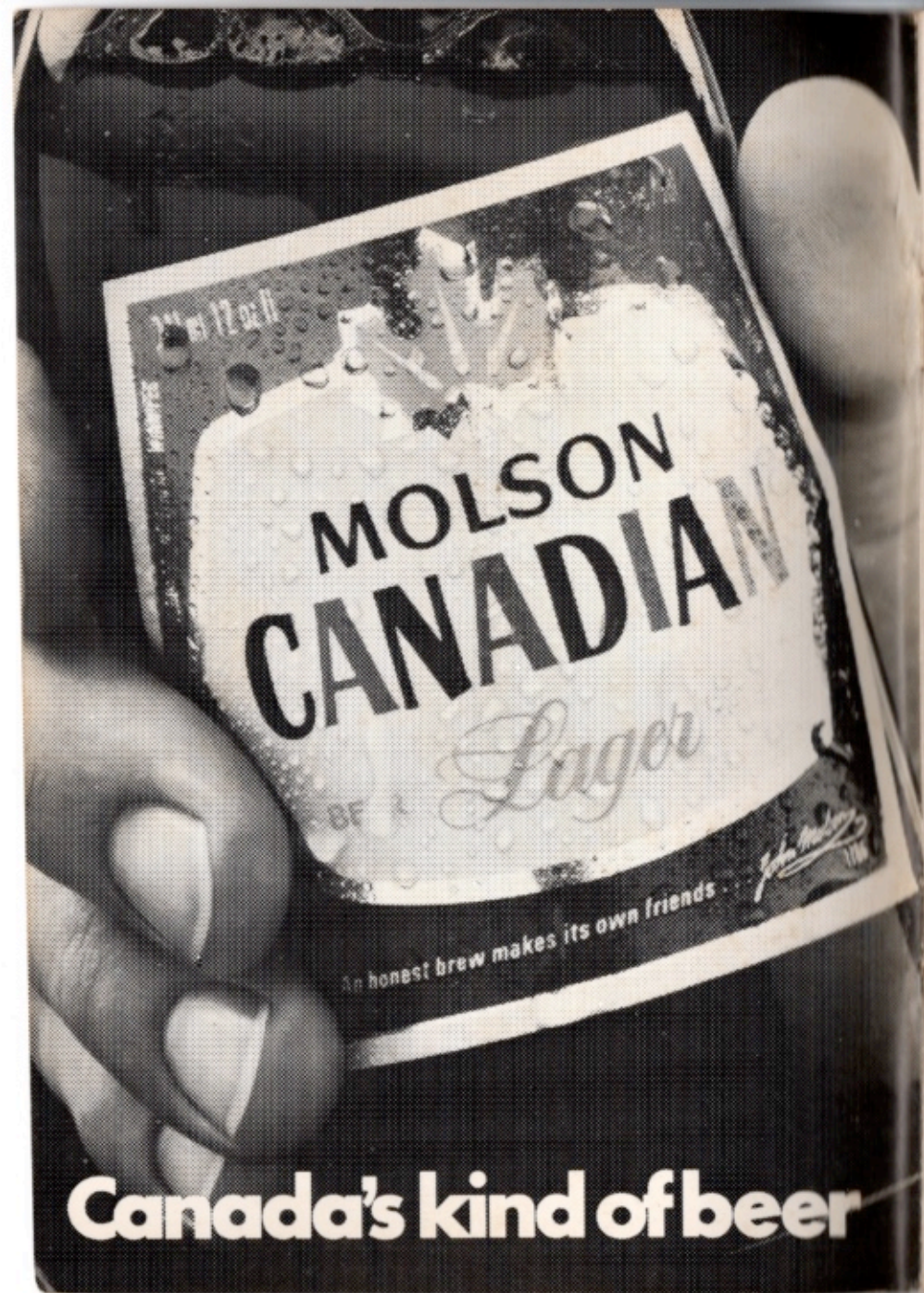

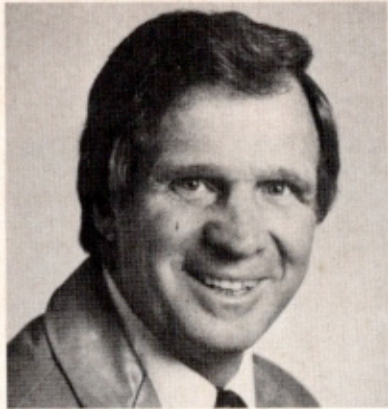
FRANK FINN
PRESIDENT

Frank Finn, a native of the Edmonton area, was named President of the Stampeder Football Club in February, 1979, after serving as Vice-President for two years. Frank moved to Calgary late in 1951 and has been an active supporter and worker for the club since that time, becoming an Associate Director in 1957 and a Director in 1968.

He has been active in the oil industry as a senior officer of several exploration and production companies during the past thirty years. He is presently Vice-President and part owner of an oilfield equipment manufacturing company based in Nisku, Alberta, and is the President of his own Natural Resource Consulting Company.

Frank played baseball professionally and hockey at a Senior A level for various teams in Canada and the United States from the late 1930's till 1947.

He served in the R.C.A.F. during the Second World War as a Pilot, Flying Instructor. He has always been active in community and business associations and served for many years as an Associate Director and Director of the Calgary Exhibition and Stampede. He is now an Honorary Life Director of that organization. He is also Chairman of the Western Canada Lottery Board of Directors for Alberta and has been a member of that Board since the founding of the Lottery.



JACK GOTTA
GENERAL MANAGER

Jack Gotta, born and raised in Northern Michigan, attended Oregon State University on an athletic scholarship and graduated in 1953. He served in the U.S. Air Force as a Lieutenant for two years and was honorably discharged in 1956.

Recruited by Otis Douglas, Jack came to the Stampeders in 1956 and played both as an offensive end and defensive back from 1956 thru 1959. He was traded to Saskatchewan in 1960, played for the Riders until 1964, and completed his playing career in Montreal that year.

Jack joined the Saskatchewan Roughriders as an assistant coach with Eagle Keys in 1965 and served in that capacity thru 1967. In 1968 he joined the Ottawa Rough Riders as assistant coach to Frank Clair for two years. He was named Head Coach of the Ottawa Rough Riders in 1970 and held that position thru 1973.

During the years Jack was coaching in the C.F.L., his teams went to the Grey Cup five times, winning four Grey Cups, once in 1966 with Saskatchewan, twice while he was assistant with Ottawa in 1968 and 1969, and once while he was Head Coach of Ottawa in 1973.

In 1974 Jack joined Birmingham of the W.F.L. as Head Coach/General Manager and coached the only World Bowl Champions in 1974. In 1975, in the re-organized W.F.L., he was named Vice President of Football Operations of the Birmingham entry and remained in Birmingham until coming to Calgary in January of 1977 as Head Coach/General Manager of the Stampeders.

Last season the Stampeders enjoyed a fine campaign with Jack being named Coach of the Year for the 1978 season.

Jack Gotta will be going into his first season as General Manager of the Stampeders after 3 seasons in the dual role of Head Coach/General Manager. He relinquished his head coaching duties to assistant coach, Ardell Wiegandt, after the 1979 season.

Jack was married in 1962 to a former Regina girl, Joan Patterson. They have four children, three sons, Jeff, Tony, Jake, and one daughter, Gia.



JOE TILLER
ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER

Joe Tiller was appointed Assistant General Manager of the Stampeder Football Club Ltd. in January, 1976. He had been the line coach with the Stampeders during the 1974 and 1975 seasons.

Joe came to the Calgary Club from Washington State University where he had been an assistant since 1971. During this time he coached both the offensive and defensive lines and in 1973 was named offensive coordinator by Head Coach Jim Sweeney at Washington State. He played his college football at Montana State University and after a fine college career, tried out with the Stamps in 1964. He returned to Montana State as an assistant coach, remaining there for seven years until 1971.

Along with Club President, Roy Jennings, Joe handled the administrative duties of the Club mid-way thru the 1976 season and then was named interim Head Coach for the last 6 games of the season.

Along with his responsibilities at the Football Club, Joe is also Stadium Manager of the McMahon Stadium Society.

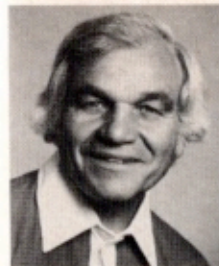
Joe and his wife, Arnette, have three children, two daughters, Renee and Julie Ann, and a three year old son, Michael.

COACHING STAFF



ARDELL WIEGANDT
HEAD COACH

This season Arde steps into the Head Coaching position after three seasons as an assistant coach with the Stampeders. A graduate of North Dakota State University, Arde played football from 1963 through 1965. He was co-captain in 1964-65. Most Valuable Player in 1965 and Little All-American in 1965. He was in the U.S. Marines for four years. Arde has coached high school football, college football at North Dakota State for five years and professional football with the Birmingham Americans of the W.F.L. for 2 years as defensive coordinator. Having coached with Jack Gotta for 2 years in the W.F.L. as defensive coordinator and three years with the Stampeders in all areas, Arde is the natural choice of General Manager Gotta to be the new Stampeder Head Coach. Arde was born on June 28, 1940, in Lakota, North Dakota.



MARVIN BASS
ASSISTANT COACH

Marvin is beginning his third season with the Stampeders. He has over thirty years of coaching experience, including four head coaching assignments. Interwoven in Coach Bass' career are assistantships at every level of collegiate and professional football. He has coached in the Southern, Atlantic Coast and Southeastern Conferences, Continental Football League, Canadian Football League, World Football League and, most recently, the National Football League. Marvin coached with the Montreal Alouettes in the 60's and was a guest coach of Jack Gotta's in Ottawa. Marvin's primary responsibility is with the defensive line.



STAN SCHWARTZ
ASSISTANT COACH

Stan is beginning his second season as a Stampeder assistant coach. He worked as an assistant with the club on a part time basis for three seasons prior to his appointment in 1979. He has been involved in many areas of the Club's operation over these years. He was previously employed by the Calgary School Board for 8 years, as a teacher counsellor. He coached High School as well as bantam thru junior football and is actively involved with the amateur football scene in Calgary.

Prior to his high school coaching, Stan played his college football at Mount Royal College and the University of Calgary. While pursuing his Masters of Science Degree in Sports Medicine, at Indiana State University, he coached Varsity Football. This season Stan's coaching responsibilities will rest with the offensive unit and with special teams. Coach Schwartz also plays an active role in player development.



DENNIS MEYER
ASSISTANT COACH

Dennis, a former Stampeders player from 1975 to 1977, returns to the Calgary Club as a Coach this season. Meyer's impressive playing career began at Arkansas State University and he was initially drafted in the sixth round by the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1972. He came to the Stampeders during the 1975 season. An outstanding defensive back as well as a return man on specialty teams, Meyer retired from active play due to an injury he received in 1977. After spending the summer months of 1978 with the Stampeders in a coaching capacity, he returned home to Georgia. There Meyer earned his Masters Degree in Educational Administration and taught and coached football at the high school level for the past two years. As the defensive secondary coach, Meyer will also assist on specialty teams, concentrating in the area of kick off and punt returns where he started as a player.



WALT POSADOWSKI
ASSISTANT COACH

Walt joins the Stampeders staff after three seasons with the Saskatchewan Roughriders, one half season of which he acted as head coach of the club. His coaching background is comprised of seven years of experience at the high school level, ten years at the American College level (Villanova, Rhode Island, and Idaho), and the three seasons in Saskatchewan from 1977 to 1979. Apart from the head coaching experience in Saskatchewan, Walt spent a season as the Director of Scouting and the balance of his stay coaching the offensive line. Here in Calgary, he will act as the offensive line coach of the Stampeders.

This will be Alex's eighth year as head trainer for the Stampeders, although he has been involved with the Club for the last seventeen years. PLAYER PROFILES

WILLIE ARMSTEAD, No. 18

Wide Receiver, Import, 6'2", 206, Yrs. Pro 5
University of Utah, Born April 10, 1952.



Willie returns to the Stampeders as an All-Star in the Western Conference in 1979, and an All Canadian at the slotback position. He was drafted first by the Cleveland Browns in 1975 after finishing a fine career at the University of Utah where he was All Western Conference and an All American, Honorable Mention. A late cut from New England in 1976, he came to Calgary for the last four games of the '76 season. After being sidelined with a broken ankle in 1977, Willie returned to shine in '78 gaining W.F.C. All Star Mention. As a returning All Canadian, he will again be a threat at the wide receiver position.

DOUG BATTERSHILL, No. 25

Linebacker, Non Import, 6'2", 200, Yrs. Pro 2
Weber State College, Born November 11, 1957.



One of Calgary's protected players in the 1978 Canadian College Draft, Doug is an excellent athlete who is a former Junior Canadian National Decathlon winner. He played high school football at Sir Winston Churchill High School before accepting an athletic scholarship at Weber State in Ogden, Utah. At college he was a starting defensive back and was chosen as a first team Big Sky Player in 1976. During the 1979 season, Doug saw regular duty as a linebacker and has the experience to become another of the outstanding backs for the Stamps this season.

WILLIE BURDEN, No. 10

Running Back, Import 5'11", 205, Years Pro 7
North Carolina State, Born July 21, 1952.



At North Carolina State Willie ran for 2,529 yards in 3 years. He was an All Conference Choice his last 2 seasons and Player of the Year in the tough Atlantic Coast Conference in 1973. A draft choice of the Detroit Lions, Willie joined the Stampeders midway through the 1974 season. He finished off the season with 4 straight 100 yards plus games and in 1975 he broke a 14 year C.F.L. record for most yards rushing in one season by running for 1,896 yards on 322 carries. That year he won the Schenley Award for Most Outstanding Player in the C.F.L. During the '76 season Willie was hampered by injuries and in 1977 he rushed for 1,032 yds. and was named a W.F.C. All Star.

KEN DOMBROWSKI, No. 62

Defensive Tackle, Import, 6'4", 260, Years Pro 2
Cameron State University, Born June 25, 1954.



Ken came to Calgary on a five day trial in 1978 after being released by the Green Bay Packers of the N.F.L. He enjoyed a tremendous season in 1978, establishing himself as a feared defensive lineman in the league. After a very strong 1980 pre-season, Ken will be tough for the season to come.

LLOYD FAIRBANKS, No. 66

Offensive Tackle, Non Import, 6'4", 236, Yrs. Pro 6
Brigham Young University, Born April 28, 1953.



A native of Raymond, Alberta, Lloyd was one of Calgary's territorial exemptions in the 1975 College Draft. He played at Ricks Junior College in Idaho before transferring to B.Y.U. in Provo, Utah. He played as a regular at offensive guard at B.Y.U. and played in the Fiesta Bowl when the team won the conference title his last year. Lloyd became a starter midway through the 1975 season and a knee injury in a 1977 pre-season game sidelined him for the whole season. In 1978 he reported in top condition and was named a W.F.C. All Star at offensive tackle. Lloyd gained All Star recognition in the Western Conference in both 1978 and 1979, as well as being named All Canadian at the offensive tackle position in 1979.

ROB FORBES, No. 6

Fullback, Non Import, 6'1", 221, Yrs. Pro 2
Drake University, Born September 17, 1956.



Rob came to Calgary in 1979 as a protected player from Toronto. He saw duty in the final four regular season games, as well as the two playoff games. Rob is rated as a big, physical running back who can play as a tight end as well. This season he will add depth to the offensive Backfield and if pre-season is one indication, Rob will be a definite asset to the Club.

TOM FORZANI, No. 22

Wide Receiver, Non Import, 5'11", 180, Yrs. Pro 7
Utah State University, Born June 15, 1951.



The third Forzani brother to play for the Stamps, Tom joined the Club in 1973 after enjoying a great college career at Utah where he was the school's All Time Receiver with 132 receptions for 1806 yards. He has played in the Blue Grey Classic and Senior Bowl All Star Games. Tom has been selected to the W.F.C. All Star Team in 1973, 1974 and 1977, the C.F.L. All Star Team in 1977 and was the runner up in the Schenley nomination for Outstanding Canadian in 1975. In 1979, Tom received the Work Warehouse Award as the Most Popular Player, as voted by the fans.

Offensive Tackle, Non Import, 6'7", 265, Yrs. Pro 3
University of Ottawa. Born October 16, 1955.



Protected by Calgary in the 1977 Canadian College Draft, Miles attended Henry Wisewood High School in Calgary and played two years with the Calgary Mohawks Junior Football team before moving to Ottawa. In 1973 while with the Mohawks he was voted the Alberta Junior Football League's Rookie of the Year. At Ottawa he was a three year starter and was selected as All Canadian defensive tackle in 1976. In 1977 he was Ottawa's M.V.P. Miles will play on the offensive line again this season. He is recognized as the largest player in the C.F.L.

JOHN T. HAY, No. 2

Kicker, Non Import, 6'0", 175, Yrs. Pro 3
Ottawa Sooners, Born September 19, 1954.



J.T. arrived in Calgary in 1978 from the Ottawa Rough Riders. In his rookie season in Ottawa he led the Eastern Conference in scoring. A native of Alexandria, Ontario, he played his junior football with the Ottawa Sooners. Beginning his second season with the Stamps, J.T. will again provide a strong leg for the kicking game.

MIKE HORTON, No. 67

Offensive Lineman, Import, 6'3", 265, Yrs. Pro 3
U.C.L.A. (76), Born July 17, 1954.



Mike Horton came to Calgary in 1979, as a free agent, for the final six regular season games, as well as playoffs. Mike's experience includes his college career; N.F.L. stays in New England, Philadelphia, and most recently, Kansas City; as well as an appearance in the movie North Dallas Forty. With his physical size and strength, Mike is able to act the role of the tackle very well and should be a driving force on that line.

JEFF INGLIS, No. 51

Offensive Tackle, Non-Import, 6'5", 255, Yrs. Pro. 1st
University of Guelph, Born December 8, 1956.



Jeff was drafted initially by the Stampeders in the 1979 Canadian College Draft. After suffering an injury which prevented him from making the roster, he returned for another year at Guelph where he became an Ontario-Quebec All-Star as an Offensive Tackle. His dominant presence will prove to solidify an already strong Offensive Line.

TERRY IRVIN, No. 28

Defensive Halfback, Import, 6'0", 180, Yrs. Pro 4
Jackson State, Born September 14, 1954.



Terry has been a starter since joining the Stamps midway through the 1977 season. He was drafted by the Chicago Bears in 1977 following an impressive college career at Jackson State where he achieved All Southwestern Athletic Conference, black college All American, Pittsburgh Courier All American, and played in the black college All American Bowl. REGGIE LEWIS, No. 60

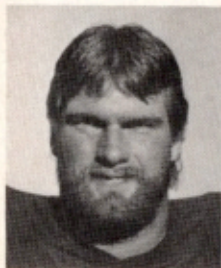
Defensive End, Import, 6'2", 240, Yrs. Pro 4

THE STAMPEDER RECORD BOOK

TOM FORZANI goes into the 1980 season as an established figure in the Record Book. First in scoring, he has moved into fifth place with 276 points (46 touchdowns) in his 7th season. Tom will need 60 points this season to match Earl Lunsford's mark of 56, to tie him for 4th spot.

In receiving, Tom is the Club's second all time receiver with a total of 387 receptions. Sitting in first spot is "Ham Hands" Herm Harrison with 443. Tom caught 58 in 1979 so he may have to wait beyond 1980 to take this honor. Forzani also trails Harrison in yards by 863 (5,830 vs. 6,693).

When we mention touchdowns, Tom is third in that department with 46 behind Lunsford (56) and Lovell Coleman (61). Scoring 8 touchdowns in '79, Tom will take the lead in that department if he can match this output both this season and next.

WILLIE BURDEN is beginning his 7th season with the Stamps. He is third on the all time rushing list with 5,720 yards in 1,133 carries (average 5.05 yards). With 675 yards in 1980, Willie will pass Lovell Coleman (6,394) and he'll be in position to reach the peak set by Earl Lunsford (6,994).

Willie also has moved on to the all time pass receiving list as number six with 227 receptions for 1,995 yards (8.78 average). He'll need 65 receptions to reach fifth ranked Terry Evanshen (291). Willie grabbed 31 in 1978 and 42 in 1979.

J.T. HAY entered the Stamp's record book in his first season. His 38 converts rank him sixth in that category. In his range this season, with only 30 converts, is fourth spot. Also in the convert area, J.T. has kicked 81 consecutive points going in 1980. This includes 43 for 43 with Ottawa in 1978 and last season's 38/38 in Calgary.

J.T. is also fourth all time in the field goal department with 21. With just 9 this season, he'll move into third spot to some day challenge Cyril McFall's 131 and ultimately, Larry Robinson's 362.

THE C.F.L. RECORD BOOK

WILLIE BURDEN continues to hold the record he set in 1975, that being covering the most ground rushing in a single season (1,896 yards in 332 carries, average 5.7).

Another achievement has left Willie ranked fourth overall for single game yards rushing. On November 2, 1975, he romped for 238 yards against Winnipeg, at home.

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

Calgary's football heroes have been known by many names. The Tigers, the 50th Battalion, the Altomahs, The Bronks and, of course, the Stampeders.

The Calgary Stampeders have experienced many trying seasons, but the history of the club, going way back to 1908, is steeped in firsts.

Like the old Tigers of 1911, they won the Western Canada Championship and in 1912, they introduced a new streamlined style of football by eliminating the two flankers on either side of the center to make for 12 man football. Joe Price, a teacher at Calgary's Central High School, instituted the change and the seniors quickly followed suit.

The Tigers called it quits in 1923 and the 50th Battalion took over. They lasted a few seasons before the Altomahs were formed with Hal Lewis at the reins. They, in turn, bowed out as the Tigers came back once more.

Another big first took place in 1929 when a Drake University import by the name of Gerry Sieberling, came north to join the Tigers as a quarterback. He astounded the football world one afternoon by dropping back and firing the ball downfield to teammate Russ Gideon. Gideon caught it and this was the first forward pass ever thrown in a Canadian game.

The Calgary Bronks came on the scene in the early 30's and a stocky quarterback from Notre Dame, by the name of Carl Cronin, came on to do the coaching.

The Club was named the Stampeders in 1946 and in 1948 brought the Grey Cup, symbolic of the Canadian Championship, to Calgary for the first time. Calgarians were to drink out of the coveted cup again but not until 1971 when they defeated the Toronto Argos 14-11 in Vancouver.

McMahon Stadium

McMahon Stadium, the creation of a number of community minded citizens, spearheaded by the McMahon brothers, Frank and George, was built, financed, and the original debt retired through revenues received from the Stampeder Football Club.

The complex is now owned by the University of Calgary on land leased from the City of Calgary and, unlike many facilities, McMahon Stadium has been, and will continue to be, self-supporting. Net revenues are shared equally by the City and the University.

Originally, McMahon Stadium was built principally and used almost exclusively for professional and University football. With assistance in the form of a Provincial grant, the play area was totally rebuilt and the natural grass rated as the best playing field in North America. It was replaced with artificial turf, this taking the first step toward the conversion of a minimum use professional stadium to a maximum use amateur stadium.

Since the installation of artificial turf, some 300 events take place yearly including high school football, junior football, flag and bantam football, soccer and field hockey. In addition, many spectator events, such as rock concerts, band concerts, military events, etc., are scheduled into McMahon Stadium.

The only Grey Cup to be played on the Prairies was held at McMahon in 1975. With the addition of temporary seating, close to 33,000 people attended.

Administration is handled by the McMahon Stadium Society. This Board is made up of two representatives from the City of Calgary, two from the University of Calgary, and two persons representing the McMahon interests. A Stadium Manager and Treasurer are appointed by the Board.

Upkeep and maintenance of the stadium is handled by a full-time superintendent, staffed on peak periods with eight full time and two part time employees. They are responsible for the care of the grounds, stands and offices of McMahon, including the administrative offices of the Stampeder Football Club Ltd., the ticket office home and visitors dressing rooms, and lounge. The three tractors and four huge blowers are just a small part of the equipment necessary to maintain the turf and stands. Cleaning the astro turf is a big job and is done with a combination carpet sweeper and vacuum cleaner, pulled by a tractor. Like any other carpet the astro turf has to be shampooed from time to time.

McMahon Stadium was built in 1960 by Burns and Dutton Construction and Concrete Company in a record of 97 days. Capacity at that time was 19,536 seats. In 1968 this was increased to 23,680, including the 1,500 seats in the Junior Quarterback section at the north end of the field, and to 27,188 in 1973.

During 1978 and early 1979, renovations were completed bringing the stadium capacity to 34,688 seats and a new box which rates with the best in the C.F.L.
